BX Scholarship Program celebrates 50 years of investing in the future

In 1959, C.O. "Monty" Montgomery, a BX board member who chaired the BX New Activities and Services committee, championed efforts to establish a scholarship program. Through his vision, and with strong support from BX first vice president, Thomas C. (T.C.) Fitzpatrick, the BX Scholarship Program was born.



The first applicants were judged on stringent criteria: each had to be a resident and in definite need of financial assistance, have a record of high scholastic achievement, and possess superior character.

Thomas L. Workman, a student studying electrical engineering at The Ohio State University, was the first to receive a scholarship from the Exchange for the 1959 school year; he received \$750 for each of two years.

Monty Montgomery passed away several years ago, but his memory is honored year after year through the BX Scholarship Program. Now 50 years old and flourishing, the program, funded by individual members and companies, has awarded more than \$800,000 in scholarship support to hundreds of promising students pursuing construction-related degrees.

Scholarship applicants today continue to be judged on the same stringent criteria, including academic achievement, extracurricular activities, financial need, and potential impact on the central Ohio construction community.

If you know students who need money for college, encourage them to apply to the BX Scholarship Program. High school and college applications for 2009-2010 scholarships will be mailed out to all members and past recipients and will soon be available online at bx.org.

Understand your contracts before you sign

What you don't know about your contracts can hurt you and your bottom line. Costly errors often occur because a contract was signed but not completely understood.

The BX course, Construction Contracting 101, is designed to help you take control of your contracts and learn how to identify and navigate the risks both before and after the deal is signed. Contract principles for both private and public projects are addressed.

This class, taught by attorneys Michael F. Copley (The Copley Law Firm, LLC) and Christopher L. McCloskey (Bricker & Eckler, LLP), covers what contracts are, how to interpret contract documents and how those documents affect what is done in the field.

Course topics include:

- how to control contract risks and obligations
- where to look for information in the contract
- contract terms that mean money
- key contracting and subcontracting issues
- which situations call for legal counsel
- expectations of each party in the contract

\$105 class or \$41,000 in OSHA penalties...you choose

Florida OSHA officials cited a tree trimming contractor for eight serious safety violations and proposed penalties totaling \$41,000 following the investigation of a Jan. 30 fatal accident.

At the center of alleged violations was that the firm "permit[ed] unauthorized employees to operate aerial lifts; fail[ed] to have a designated employee observe an aerial lift and give timely warning before the lift gets too close to power lines, and fail[ed] to provide proper safety training to employees," ("OSHA Cites Company after Tree Trimming Fatality," Region 4 News Release: USDOL: 01-119, 16 July 2001).

Experience alone does not replace proper training and certification.

Training and certification can happen one of two ways – do it in-house by your safety person/trainer, or send them to a trusted source. Beginning in 2009, the Builders Exchange of Central Ohio will offer both.

If your firm has occasion to use aerial work platforms (both scissors and articulating boom

lifts) but can't justify the expense of training an in-house trainer, let the BX do the training for you! Attend Aerial Lift Operator Training at the BX on Friday, Feb. 6 from 8 a.m. to noon.

Registration and a continental breakfast begin at 7:30 a.m. Instructed by David Hoover and Kim Winger (Forklift Training Systems), you'll learn from two experienced professionals who have testified in legal proceedings related to injuries and fatalities from misuse and lack of equipment training.

During this session, you will learn the required OSHA standards and ANSI best practices for aerial lifts. Topics include:

- aerial lift hazards including falls, tip-over, collision and electrocution
- types of aerial lifts, applications and parts
- equipment capacities and limitations
- fall protection requirements
- hazard identification (surface conditions, tight areas, traffic, wind, etc.)
- bystanders and safety

- rules for travel, parking and basic operations
- vehicle inspections
- case studies involving real injuries and fatalities

The course ends with a pass/fail written test all students must complete. Passing operators can then be evaluated on the job by your in-house safety person/trainer or supervisor to complete their certification. Forms will be provided.

The cost is \$95 per person for BX Workers' Comp Group members, \$105 for other BX members and \$125 for nonmembers. To receive a refund, written cancellations must be received by Friday, Jan. 30.

Have a need for regular equipment training?

If forklifts and aerial lifts are commonly used on your projects, you may find it more efficient to train one individual to perform your entire in-house operator training program. Ensure your trainer's understanding of the applicable regulations by sending them to Forklift and Aerial Lift Train-the-Trainer.

Designed to meet the needs of companies owning or regularly using this equipment, this course will be held Wednesday, Feb. 4 through Friday, Feb. 6 at the BX.

Registration and a continental breakfast begin at 7:30 a.m. with the program from 8 to 5 p.m. each day. Lunch is also included in the program cost.
