Educate supervisors with the OSHA 30-Hour Safety Training Course

"OSHA 30-Hour Training is invaluable to your front-line supervisors," said BX Director of Safety Mary Logan.

"Especially for supervisors who oversee other trades, the OSHA 30-Hour provides an opportunity to look at the ten most common and deadly hazards in construction.

"Even if the hazard doesn't directly pertain to your work, often employees are exposed to hazards created by other contractors around them."

Educate your employees on the safety hazards they face by registering them today for the OSHA 30-Hour Training Course at the BX.

The program is ideal for safety directors and job supervisors, including superintendents, foremen, project managers and crew leaders.

Class topics include fall protection, scaffolding, electrical safety, trenching, hand and power tools, fire prevention, general OSHA information and hazard communication.

Brian Basbagill, CSP (Safex) will teach the course at the Exchange on four consecutive Fridays – Feb. 13, 20, 27 and March 6. The program begins with registration and a continental breakfast from 7:30 to 8 a.m., followed by the class from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

When you finish the class, you will receive a course completion card from the OSHA Training Institute.

SUCCESSFUL PROJECT DOCUMENTATION SET FOR FEB. 10 AND 12

Documentation is vital to a successful project

Keeping proper documentation on any project will save you time, energy and money as well as provide a clear record of work. Train your employees to address problems with solutions and methods on how to document clearly by sending them to the BX course, Successful Project Documentation.

"The only way to improve productivity is to understand what's going on and how problems are being addressed, and to do so, you must be attentive to documentation," said attorney and course instructor, Michael D. Tarullo (Schottenstein, Zox & Dunn).

Tarullo teaches project managers, superintendents, project engineers and owner representatives practical documentation and record-keeping techniques that impact project success.

"In this course, we're trying to make attendees better risk managers to control their own destiny and the destiny of their company," Tarullo said.

- Defining Success and How to Achieve It
- Basic Contract Concepts
- Critical Contract Clauses and Ohio Law
- Understanding Communication Needs
- Understanding What and Why Documentation is Needed
- Suggested Form Documents and Critical Components

Safety Program

Non-certified operators cost Denver firm \$207,000 in penalties

A Denver-based fabricator and distributor finished a five-day OSHA inspection with a laundry-list of citations and penalties totaling \$207,000 ("Safety Hazards at Denver Glass Fabricator and Distributor Lead to \$207,000 in Proposed OSHA Fines," Region 8 News Release: OSHA2-30, 26 July 2002).

The citations specifically noted inadequate training for forklift operators, improper modifications to equipment without manufacturer approval and failure to ensure safe equipment operation. Non-certified operators cost money. Experience alone does not replace proper training and certification.

If your firm has occasion to use aerial work platforms (both scissors and articulating boom lifts) but can't justify the expense of training an in-house trainer, let the BX do the training for you! Attend Aerial Lift Operator Training at the BX on Friday, Feb. 6 from 8 a.m. to noon.

Registration and a continental breakfast begin at 7:30 a.m. Instructed by David Hoover and Kim Wingler (Forklift Training Systems), you'll learn from two experienced professionals who have testified in legal proceedings related to injuries and fatalities from misuse and lack of equipment training.

During this session, you will learn the required OSHA standards and ANSI best practices for aerial lifts. Topics include:

- aerial lift hazards including falls, tip-over, collision and electrocution
- types of aerial lifts, applications and parts
- equipment capacities and limitations
- hazard identification (surface conditions, tight areas, traffic, wind, etc.)
- vehicle inspections

The course ends with a pass/fail written test all students must complete. Passing operators can then be evaluated on the job by your in-house safety person/trainer or supervisor to complete their certification. Forms will be provided.

The cost is \$95 per person for BX Workers' Comp Group members, \$105 for other BX members and \$125 for nonmembers. To receive a refund, written cancellations must be received by Friday, Jan. 30.

Have a need for regular equipment training?

If forklifts and aerial lifts are commonly used on your projects, you may find it more efficient to train one individual to perform your entire in-house operator training program. Ensure your trainer's understanding of the applicable regulations by sending them to Forklift and Aerial Lift Train-the-Trainer.

Designed to meet the needs of companies owning or regularly using this equipment, this course will be held Wednesday, Feb. 4 through Friday, Feb. 6 at the BX.

Registration and a continental breakfast begin at 7:30 a.m. with the program from 8 to 5 p.m. each day. Lunch is also included in the program cost.

OSHA says "all operator training and evaluation shall be conducted by persons who have the knowledge, training, and experience to train powered industrial truck operators and evaluate their competence." So who trains your employees?
