Peterson named recipient of 2009 BX Cornerstone Award

Parr Peterson, president of Paul Peterson Co., has been named the 2009 BX Cornerstone recipient.

A longtime member and supporter of the BX, Peterson has been involved in the industry for more than 30 years.

The award, considered to be the highest honor presented by the central Ohio construction industry, recognizes an individual's leadership contributions to the community, the industry and the Exchange.

In announcing Peterson as winner, BX Board President Jim Smith (Elford, Inc.) remarked that "in a year where there have been numerous uncertainties, it is a bright spot to recognize you with this honor. You have brought so much passion in leadership, not only to the Builders Exchange, but to the lives of so many individuals."

Peterson served on the BX Board of Directors for nine years, serving as president in 2004. He also served on the Builders Exchange Foundation Board of Directors. Peterson remains involved with the BX as a speaker for the Outreach program, an ambassador for the membership department and an instructor for safety programs.

In addition to his BX involvement, Peterson serves on the

board of the Ohio Contractors Association. He is past president of the Upper Arlington Civic Association and is a volunteer for the Columbus Speech and Hearing Center.

Peterson was selected to receive the Cornerstone Award by the BX board of directors, based on an initial review by the BX Cornerstone Award Review Committee. The recipient is chosen based on achievements in the following areas: BX involvement, industry involvement, industry impact, community involvement, and years of service to the industry.

The Cornerstone Award will officially be presented to Peterson on Thursday, Nov. 19 at the Aladdin Shrine Center at the 117th BX Annual Meeting.

The 2009 BX Cornerstone Award Review Committee is made up of seven members including Chairman Mark Setterlin, (R.W. Setterlin Building Co.), Eric Bull (The Quandel Group, Inc.), Wade Hungerford (MCR Services, Inc.), John Igel (George J. Igel & Co., Inc.), Don Leach (Dinsmore & Shohl, LLP), Pat McLaughlin (cHc Manufacturing, Inc.) and Charlie Steitz (Sauer Group, Inc.).

More than 200 companies earn recognition from the State of Ohio

More than 200 members of the Safety Council of Greater Columbus will earn awards from their participation in the state's safety council program on Wednesday, April 15.

The Annual Awards Banquet recognizes firms that have reached certain safety milestones. The awards are based on two semi-annual injury and illness reports each firm submits as part of their participation, and four types of awards are distributed:

- **Group Award** – lowest incident rate in each SCGC group
- **Achievement Award** – 25-percent reduction in incident rate from the previous year
- **100% Award** – one year without a lost-time injury or illness
- **Special Award** – at least 500,000 hours and at least six months without a lost-time injury

The banquet is sponsored by lead sponsor: Trucco Construction Co., Inc. and major sponsors: the Careworks Family of Companies and Sauer Group, Inc. The banquet features keynote speaker Archie Griffin, former OSU Buckeye football player and the only two-time Heisman Trophy winner. Learn about the individuals who have inspired Archie during his life and how those individuals have shaped the values he lives by today.

Griffin is the only two-time winner of the prestigious Heisman Trophy. He was a three time All American in 1973, 1974 and 1975. He is listed in NCAA's "100 Most Influential Student-Athletes" and was appointed to the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame Board of Directors.



Griffin received the Duffy Daugherty Award presented by Michigan State University given to individuals for lifetime achievement and contribution to collegiate football. And, locally, he has been inducted in the Ohio High School Athletic Association Circle of Champions, which recognizes former Ohio high school student-athletes who have demonstrated outstanding character and accomplishments both on and off the field.

After being a first-round draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals in 1976, Archie played seven years there as co-captain. He returned to serve at OSU in 1984. Currently, Archie is the executive director of The Ohio State Alumni Association.

The Safety Council of Greater Columbus will also be recognized at the banquet for earning second place honors in the state. All 80 councils in the state of Ohio compete for recognition as the top safety council of the year. The SCGC, eligible for awards since 2006, has earned an award each year: 1st place in 2006, honorable mention in 2007, and 2nd place in 2008.

Anyone is welcome to attend the Awards Banquet from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Wednesday, April 15. Tickets are \$35 per person and include lunch.
