Criteria for Craftsmanship nominations:

- The Craftsmanship Award recognizes an individual, not a project.
- Awards will only be given to employees of BX member firms.
- The individual nominated must be the craftsman who performed the work.
- Nominations will not be accepted for general superintendents, project superintendents or general foreman.
- All nominations must be for commercial, institutional or industrial work.
- The work nominated must have been completed within the past year.
- Completed projects must be in the central Ohio area: Delaware, Fairfield, Franklin, Licking, Madison, Pickaway or Union counties.
- Three to ten digital photos are required to be submitted with the nomination.

Please Note: If the work cannot be photographed for public viewing, by the Builders Exchange photographer, it will be ineligible.



Safety Program

Safety ignorance = citations and criminal prosecution

Ignorance of safety violations can mean substantial OSHA citations and penalties in addition to criminal prosecution. Consider the demolition contractor who went to prison after an employee was killed when a cement floor gave way, crushing him by a falling beam.

Claiming he was unaware that the cement floor did not have the structural integrity to hold the equipment, the owner was found criminally negligent and sentenced to four months in prison and a \$100,000 OSHA penalty.

The demolition contractor is not the first to serve time for violating known hazards in the construction industry. Since the Occupational Safety and Health Administration was created more than 30 years ago, more than 200,000 workplace deaths have occurred. The OSHA website and the U.S. Department of Justice have dozens of high-profile cases documented where individuals either served time in federal prisons or citations and penalties were leveled against the company.

Educate your employees on the safety hazards they face by registering them today for the OSHA 30-Hour Training Course at the BX.

The program is ideal for safety directors and job supervisors, including superintendents, foremen, project managers and crew leaders.

Class topics include fall protection, scaffolding, electrical safety, trenching, hand and power tools, fire prevention, general OSHA information and hazard communication.

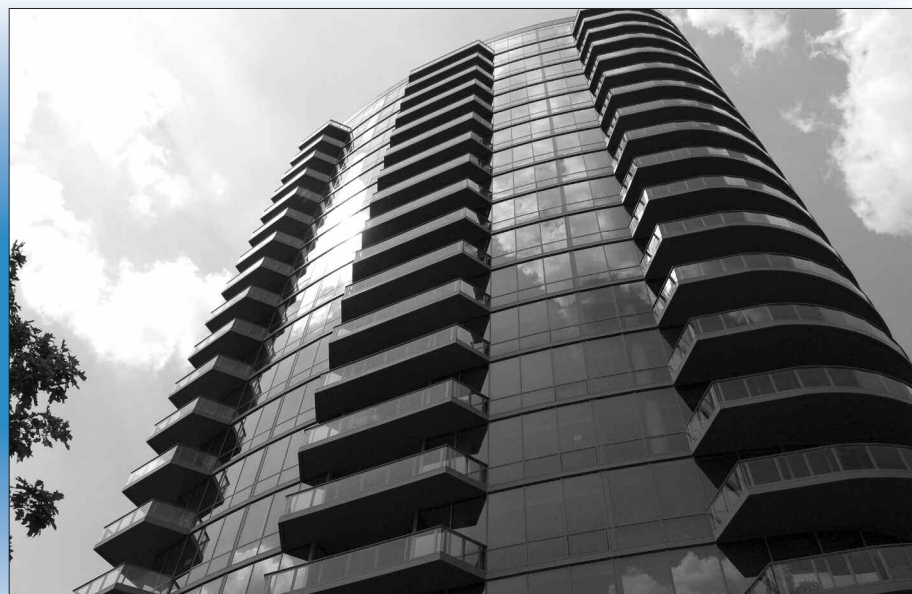
Brian Basbagill, CSP (Safex) will teach the course at the Exchange on Fridays – April 24, May 1, 8 and 15. The program begins with registration and a continental breakfast from 7:30 to 8 a.m., followed by the class from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

When you finish the class, you will receive a course completion card from the OSHA Training Institute.

The cost is \$469 per person for participants in the BX Workers' Comp Group and \$609 for other BX members. For nonmembers, the cost is \$809.

A volume discount of 10% is offered for companies sending five or more participants, and 20% for companies sending 10 or more participants.

In conjunction with the Ohio BWC, Division of Safety & Hygiene, the Safety Council of Greater Columbus presents its fourth Annual Awards Banquet on Wednesday, April 15. More than 200 firms will be recognized for improving safety statistics.

The awards were determined based on the semi-annual injury and illness reports that companies submitted as part of participation in the council. For the SCGC's fourth annual awards banquet, the BWC will be recognizing companies in the following categories:



- **Group Award** – for the lowest incident rate in each SCGC industry specific group
- **Achievement Award** – for a 25% reduction in incident rate from the previous year
- **100% Award** – for firms going one year without a lost-time injury or illness
- **Special Award** – for firms achieving at least 500,000 hours and at least six months without a lost-time injury
