New organization helps unemployed members stay linked to the industry

"BXConnect is a wonderful way to stay in touch with my contacts in the industry," she said, noting, "The worst thing people can do after losing their jobs is isolate themselves. I need both the resources and the connection that this program brings."

To retain the relationships that are so important to the industry's success, the Builders Exchange has launched a new initiative, BXConnect.

BXConnect is a network for construction professionals in transition, providing information and resources while keeping them linked to the BX and the local construction community.

"These individuals have been vital contributors to our industry," said Jim Smith (Elford, Inc.), Exchange board president. "Member firms need to keep in touch with them and help them find new opportunities as soon as possible."

In developing BXConnect, Smith said the BX board of directors saw benefits for both member companies and unemployed individuals.

"It's so difficult to lay off talented

professionals. The Exchange wants to help both employers and employees with connections they need moving forward."

The Builders Exchange has created a membership in BXConnect, that employers may purchase for former employees or individuals may purchase themselves, for just \$50 through December 31. The benefits that come with BXConnect membership are specifically for

unemployed individuals, accessing them to most BX programs.

"While the duration of this recession is debated, one thing is certain: it will end eventually," Smith noted. "And when construction gets moving again, the industry will need to be in touch with all the talent it's been forced to forfeit in the interim."

Safety milestones to be celebrated by Bureau of Workers' Compensation

More than 200 members of the Safety Council of Greater Columbus will earn awards from their participation in the state's safety council program on Wednesday, April 15.

The Annual Awards Banquet recognizes firms that have reached certain safety milestones. The awards, selected by the Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation, are based on two semi-annual injury and illness reports each firm submits as part of their participation, and four types of awards are distributed:

- **Group Award** – lowest incident rate in each SCGC group
- **Achievement Award** – 25-percent reduction in incident rate from the previous year



- **100% Award** – one year without a lost-time injury or illness
- **Special Award** – at least 500,000 hours and at least six months without a lost-time injury

The banquet is sponsored by lead sponsor: Trucco Construction Co., Inc. and major sponsors: the Careworks Family of Companies and Sauer Group, Inc. The banquet features keynote speaker Archie Griffin, former OSU Buckeye football player and the only two-time Heisman Trophy winner. Learn about the individuals who have inspired Archie during his life and how those individuals have shaped the values he lives by today.

Griffin is the only two-time winner of the prestigious Heisman Trophy. He was a three time All American in 1973, 1974 and 1975. He is listed in NCAA's "100 Most Influential Student-Athletes"

and was appointed to the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame Board of Directors.

Griffin received the Duffy Daugherty Award presented by Michigan State University given to individuals for lifetime achievement and contribution to collegiate football. And, locally, he has been inducted in the Ohio High School Athletic Association Circle of Champions, which recognizes former Ohio high school student-athletes who have demonstrated outstanding character and accomplishments both on and off the field.

After being a first-round draft pick of the Cincinnati Bengals in 1976, Archie played seven years there as co-captain. He returned to serve at OSU in 1984. Currently, Archie is the executive director of The Ohio State Alumni Association.

The Safety Council of Greater Columbus will also be recognized at the banquet for earning

second place honors in the state. All 80 councils in the state of Ohio compete for recognition as the top safety council of the year. The SCGC, eligible for awards since 2006, has earned an award each year: 1st place in 2006, honorable mention in 2007, and 2nd place in 2008.

Anyone is welcome to attend the Awards Banquet from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Wednesday, April 15. Tickets are \$35 per person and include lunch.

 - Nominations will not be accepted for general superintendents, project superintendents or general foreman.
 - All nominations must be for commercial, institutional or industrial work.
 - The work nominated must have been completed within the past year.
 - Completed projects must be in the central Ohio area: Delaware, Fairfield, Franklin, Licking, Madison, Pickaway or Union counties.
 - Three to ten digital photos are required to be submitted with the nomination.
- Please Note:** If the work cannot be photographed for public viewing, by the Builders Exchange photographer, it will be ineligible.

EARN OSHA COURSE COMPLETION CARDS

Meet training requirements on Ohio School Facilities Commission jobs

Under Resolution 07-98, the Ohio School Facilities Commission decreed that Ohio contractors working on Ohio school projects must comply with "Responsible Bidding Requirements." Among the requirements include several safety provisions – including OSHA training.

Specifically, the OSFC says, "For projects advertised after October 1, 2007, the Executive Director will only approve contracts in which the Bidder has certified that it...has implemented a written safety program, that each member of his job site workforce has completed an OSHA 10 or 30 Hour Construction Course, and that all project supervisors and all project foremen have completed an OSHA 30 hour Construction Course," (http://www.osfc.state.oh.us/pdfs/Resolution_07-98.pdf).

Don't miss out on complying with bidder requirements. Attend the next OSHA 30-Hour Training Course hosted by the Builders Exchange of Central Ohio.

Brian Basbagill, CSP (Safex) will teach the course at the Exchange on four consecutive Fridays – April 24, May 1, 8 and 15. The program begins with registration and a continental breakfast from 7:30 to 8 a.m., followed by the class from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

When you finish the class, you will receive a course completion card from the OSHA Training Institute.

The cost is \$469 per person for participants in the BX Workers' Comp Group and \$609 for other BX members. For nonmembers, the cost is \$809.
