Safety Program

OSHA-authorized training is first step to competency

“The first step to safety competency for anyone – including managers, foremen and superintendents – is the OSHA 30-Hour Training Course,” said Brian Basbagill, CSP (Safex), an OSHA-authorized instructor. It is an extremely important class to help you become competent, because it provides in-depth information on safe practices and OSHA regulations, he explained. Topics include:

- fall protection
- scaffolding
- trenching
- fire prevention
- hazard communication
- electrical safety
- protective equipment
- OSHA inspections
- safety programs and training

Basbagill will teach the OSHA

30-Hour Course at the BX this spring, for four consecutive Fridays – April 24, May 1, 8 and 15.

Registration, with a continental breakfast begins at 7:30 a.m., with the program from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. daily. You must attend all four sessions to successfully complete the course.

The curriculum is authorized by OSHA, so when you finish the class, you receive a course completion card from the OSHA Training Institute.

The cost is \$469 for participants in the BX Workers' Comp Group, \$609 for other BX members and \$809 for nonmembers.

A volume discount of 10 percent is offered for companies sending five or more participants, and 20 percent for 10 or more participants.

To receive refunds, cancellation requests must be made by Friday, April 17.

Train your whole staff in one fell swoop

Accident prevention should be the focus of your company safety program, but you also should be prepared to handle an emergency situation.

This includes making “provisions prior to the commencement of a project for prompt medical attention in case of serious injury,” according to the OSHA Code of Federal Regulations 29, Part 1926.50(b).

Without these provisions for care, you could be subject to an OSHA fine – or worse, you could have a serious injury that no one is prepared to treat.

Avoid these problems by training your whole staff in first aid and CPR skills in only one afternoon.

The BX teaches these skills several times a year at the class, Standard First Aid/CPR.

The next session will be held at the Exchange on Wednesday, May 6 from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. at the BX. Registration, with coffee and donuts, begins at 7:30 a.m.

- CPR
- conscious and unconscious choking victims
- heart attacks, strokes and seizures
- burns
- heat-related and cold-related illnesses
- bandaging and splints
- reducing the risk of disease transmission

Deb Murphy (Builders Exchange) will teach the program.

Upon successful completion of the course, students receive a certificate in CPR that is valid for two years, and a certificate in first aid that is valid for three years from the Emergency Care and Safety Institute.

The course is \$45 for participants in the BX Workers' Comp Group, \$65 for other BX members and \$95 for nonmembers.

To receive refunds, cancellations must be made to the BX by Wednesday, April 29.

'Challenge' your skills

If a refresher course is all you need, the BX Safety Program offers the CPR Challenge, a course designed to renew your CPR certificate.

At the class, you will receive a brief review of CPR and other lifesaving skills, and must pass both a written and a hands-on test to renew your certification.

The CPR Challenge is from 2 to 4 p.m. on Thursday, May 7 and is instructed by Kelly Purcell (Builders Exchange).

The cost is \$35 for participants in the BX Workers' Comp Group, \$45 for other BX members and \$65 for nonmembers.

 - Three to ten digital photos are required to be submitted with the nomination.
- Please Note:** If the work cannot be photographed for public viewing, by the Builders Exchange photographer, it will be ineligible.

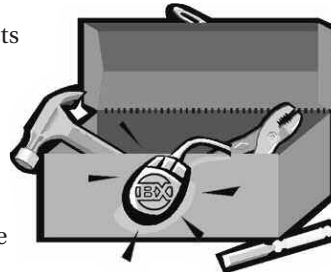

OSHA training is for all employees



If you work in construction, you should attend the OSHA 10-Hour Training Course. "The course is not just for management personnel," said Mary Logan, BX director of safety. "In fact, it's more appropriate for field employees who are faced with safety hazards every day, and who need the knowledge to protect themselves and the people around them," she said.

"It's even beneficial for employees who've had the training before. We recommend that employees update their training certificates every three years to remain fresh with the changes that OSHA has made.

"It also enables employees who have moved around in their job to acquaint themselves with changing jobsite hazards they might not have been directly affected by before," Logan said.

The 10-Hour Training Course is offered throughout the year at the Exchange, but the next time it will be offered in 2009 will be

Tuesday and Thursday, May 12 and 14 from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. each day. Registration and a continental breakfast begin at 7:30 a.m. Scott Gibson (RiskControl360) will instruct the course.
