BXConnect can keep laid off professionals in touch

If you know industry colleagues who have lost their jobs due to the recession, encourage them to stay active, visible and connected through a new organization created by the Builders Exchange.

BXConnect is a network for construction professionals in transition, providing information and resources while keeping them linked to the BX and the local construction community.

"It's incredible to hear – almost every day – that more of our industry's top talent have lost their positions," said Cathy Blackford, BX executive director.

The Exchange board has created a membership in BXConnect, that employers may purchase for former employees or individuals may purchase themselves, for just \$50 through December 31. The benefits that come with BXConnect membership are specifically for unemployed individuals, accessing them to most BX programs.

BXConnect will most benefit the individuals who have been actively involved in the industry, Blackford speculated.

"The first three members are Pat Shuster and Rick Martine – both of whom have won the BX President's Award for their years of volunteer service – and Sally Falk, who is a leader in our Safety Council," she said.

Insurance continuation seminars set for employers and laid off employees

To help both individuals who have lost their jobs, and the employers who must provide insurance continuation information, two free BX programs on Monday, May 4 will detail the new Stimulus Package Subsidy for COBRA and the State Continuation Program for small (fewer than 20 employees) companies.

Representatives from the Ohio Department of Insurance and CCI Benefit Solutions will conduct the hour-long seminars, which will be held at the Builders Exchange:

- 9 to 10 a.m. — For employees who have been involuntarily terminated since September 1, 2008
- 10:30 to 11:30 a.m. — For employers of all sizes (COBRA-eligible or smaller firms), who want to understand the program requirements

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA), signed by President Obama, provides qualified individuals who are not eligible for other group coverage with a 65% government subsidy for up to nine months starting April 1, 2009 under the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 (COBRA). Here's how it works:

For COBRA-Eligible Groups (20 Employees or More):

Employees who have been involuntarily terminated back to September 2008 will have another opportunity to elect coverage. COBRA premiums will be subsidized by 65% beginning April 1st and will last through the end of 2009. Employees will pay the reduced rate and submit premiums to their former company.

After March 1, 2009 employees will pay 35% of their COBRA premium to their former employer. The employer remits the full premium to the insurance carrier and then deducts the remaining 65% from their quarterly payroll taxes (941).

For Groups with fewer than 20 Employees:

Employees working for small firms may continue health care coverage for 6 months or 12 months depending on the renewal date of their company's health insurance plan. The 65% subsidy also begins April 1st and continues for the remainder of 2009.

After April 1, employees will pay 35% of their premium to their former employer. The employer remits the 35% payment to the insurance company as payment in full. Thereafter, the insurance company applies for the remaining 65% reimbursement.

The BX offers the OSHA 10-Hour Training

Course several times a year, with the next session Tuesday and Thursday, May 12 and 14.

The program begins with registration and a continental breakfast from 7:30 to 8 a.m., followed by the class from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

Jason Savasta and Scott Gibson (RiskControl360) will conduct the class.

The course covers 10 of the most dangerous and common hazards in the construction industry, including:

- fall protection
- scaffolding safety
- stairways and ladders
- excavations
- electrical safety
- personal protective equipment

- fire protection and prevention
- hand and power tools
- safety program and training
- hazard communication

The cost is \$129 per person for participants in the BX Workers' Comp Group and \$209 for other BX members. For nonmembers the cost is \$369, and nonmembers must pay in advance.

A volume discount of 10 percent is offered for companies sending five or more participants, and 20 percent for companies sending 10 or more participants.

To receive refunds, cancellation requests must be received one week in advance.

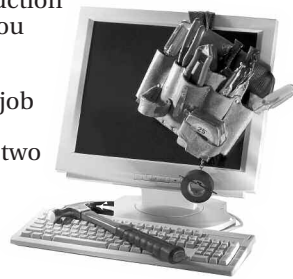

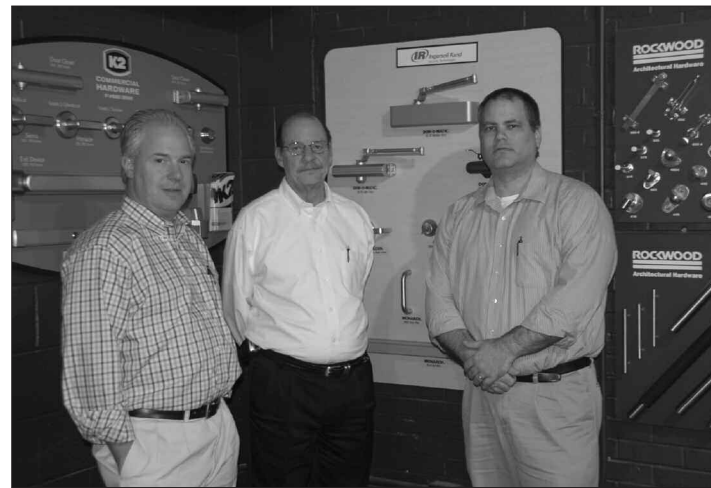

“These are the people that want to maintain the many professional relationships they developed, and we are committed to help.”

A 22-year veteran of the industry, whose positions ranged from accounting to purchasing to human resources, Falk said she was thrilled to hear about *BXConnect*.

“*BXConnect* will be a great way stay current with what is going on, so when I do get my next job I will not feel out of the loop,” said Falk, who is secretary of the steering committee of the Safety Council of Greater Columbus.
