2009 BX SCHOLARSHIP RECIPIENTS ANNOUNCED

\$50,000 awarded in recognition of scholarship's 50th anniversary

The first Builders Exchange scholarship was awarded in 1959. Fifty years later the tradition of investing in future leaders continues. This year, the BX Scholarship Trustees have awarded \$50,000 to 48 high school and college students pursuing construction-related careers. Individual scholarships ranged from \$500 to \$2,000.

Recipients were judged on criteria including academic achievement, financial need, and their potential future impact on the central Ohio construction community.

Today, the Scholarship Program, administered by the Builders Exchange Foundation, is funded increasingly through perpetual scholarships established to honor a particular industry icon or family.

BXConnect to offer insurance continuation seminars

information, two free BX programs on Monday, May 4 will detail the new Stimulus Package Subsidy for COBRA and the State Continuation Program for small (fewer than 20 employees) companies.

Representatives from the Ohio Department of Insurance and CCI Benefit Solutions will conduct the hour-long seminars, which will be held at the Builders Exchange:

- **9 to 10 a.m. — For employees who have been involuntarily terminated since September 1, 2008**
- **10:30 to 11:30 a.m. — For employers of all sizes (COBRA-eligible or smaller firms), who want to understand the program requirements**

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA), signed by President Obama, provides qualified individuals who are not eligible for other group coverage with a 65% government subsidy for up to nine months starting March 1, 2009 under the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 (COBRA). Here's how it works:

For COBRA-Eligible Groups (20 Employees or More):

Employees who have been involuntarily terminated back to September 2008 will have another opportunity to elect coverage. COBRA premiums will be subsidized by 65% beginning March 1st and will last through the end of 2009. Employees will pay the reduced rate and submit premiums to their former company.

After March 1, 2009 employees will pay 35% of their COBRA premium to their former employer. The employer remits the full premium to the insurance carrier and then deducts the remaining 65% from their quarterly payroll taxes (form 941).

For Groups with fewer than 20 Employees:

Employees working for small firms may continue health care coverage for 6 months or 12 months depending on the renewal date of their company's health insurance plan. The 65% subsidy also begins March 1st and continues for the remainder of 2009.

After March 1, employees will pay 35% of their premium to their former employer. The employer remits the 35% payment to the insurance company as payment in full. Thereafter, the insurance company applies for the remaining 65% reimbursement.

DFWP training for employees and supervisors

Rising Leader Comments: "I know the Rising Leaders program will enhance my leadership and management skills. I would recommend this program to all mid-level managers who strive to advance to the next level."

The Rising Leaders Institute (RLI), supported by a grant from the Builders Exchange Foundation, is an intensive, 12-session program focused on building management skills and business knowledge of high potential individuals, and preparing them to serve as the future leaders in the construction industry.

Participants in the Rising Leaders Institute are required to have a champion from their company, a manager who acts as their mentor throughout the program. Ruff's mentor is Jason Ruff, general manager of Performance Site Environmental, LLC.

With a curriculum developed for the Builders Exchange by The Ohio State University Fisher College of Business, the sessions are taught by OSU faculty members.

Ohio State construction management students finish strong in national ABC competition

While Buckeye athletes may struggle with the University of Florida, one up-and-coming OSU team dethroned the Gators recently in a national competition.

The Ohio State Student Construction Management Team, participating this winter for the first time in the national Associated Builders and Contractors (ABC) Student Construction Management Competition, won fourth place overall. The competition was held at ABC's national convention, Feb. 25-Mar. 1, in Honolulu.

In addition to its overall finish, the four-student Ohio State team took first place in the Estimating Category – beating three-year estimating champion, University of Florida. The schools were among 21 colleges and universities participating in the ABC competition, in which students earned points in three categories: Estimating, Safety and Project Management/Scheduling.

"The competition was quite an experience for our team," said Alex Belkofer, a fifth-year student and Buckeye team captain. He said the student teams received plans and specs for the competition project in the second week of January, and then at the competition, took part in a bid-day drill.

"Teams were given subcontractor bids every 15 minutes and were required to submit an overall bid form. The teams had to assemble supporting materials justifying calculations in their bids," he said.

The original field was narrowed to five finalists, who scrambled to make project presentations the next day to a group of professional ABC member judges. Belkofer said the Ohio State group – which consisted of four "first team" competing students and four "in training" backup members – was thrilled to finish so well its first time out.



The nationally-ranked OSU Construction Management Competition Team included Alex Belkofer, Team Captain; Jake McMinn, Erik Reish, Jim Moyer, Matt Bensman, Eric Adamski, Jake Miller and Jessica Wolfe. Their advisors were Mary Tebeau, president of ABC Central Ohio, Larry Parnell (Pepper Construction Co. of Ohio) and Brent Swonger (Lithko Contracting, Inc.).

"It felt amazing – we beat Florida, LSU, Purdue. And all the competing schools were very welcoming and supportive of our efforts in representing Ohio State for the first time at the ABC convention," he said.

Jason Savasta and Scott Gibson (RiskControl360) will conduct the next 10-Hour Course at the BX on Tuesday and Thursday, May 12 and 14.

The program begins with registration and a continental breakfast from 7:30 to 8 a.m., followed by the class from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

When you finish the class, you will receive a course completion card from the OSHA Training Institute.

The cost is \$129 per person for participants in the BX Workers' Comp Group and \$209 for other BX members. The cost for nonmembers is \$369.

A volume discount of 10 percent is offered for companies sending five or more participants, and 20 percent for companies sending 10 or more participants.

To receive refunds, cancellation requests must be made by Tuesday, May 5.
