INSURANCE CONTINUATION SEMINAR

Do you understand the new COBRA and mini-COBRA requirements?

To help employers who must provide insurance continuation information, the BX will host another program that will detail the new Stimulus Package Subsidy for COBRA and the State Continuation Program for small (fewer than 20 employees) companies.

Representatives from the Ohio Department of Insurance and CCI Benefit Solutions will conduct the hour-long seminar, which will be held at the Builders Exchange on Tuesday, June 9, 9:30-10:30 a.m.

"In addition to the subsidy and minor changes to COBRA, the stimulus and our state government have made significant changes for employees who are terminated from small

businesses," stated Scott Miller (CCI Benefit Solutions.)

"Attend the June 9 program to find out which employees are eligible for the subsidy, what notices must be sent and which files you need to maintain," Miller added.

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA), signed by President Obama, provides qualified individuals who are not eligible for other group coverage with a 65% government subsidy for up to nine months starting March 1, 2009 under the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 (COBRA).

Here's how it works:
For COBRA-eligible groups (20 employees or more):

Employees who have been involuntarily terminated back to September 2008 will have another opportunity to elect coverage. COBRA premiums will be subsidized by 65% beginning March 1st and will last through the end of 2009. Employees will pay 35% of their COBRA premium to their former employer. The employer remits the full premium to the insurance carrier and then deducts the remaining 65% from their quarterly payroll taxes (form 941).

For groups with fewer than 20 employees:

Employees working for small firms may continue health care coverage for six months or 12 months depending on the renewal date of their company's health insurance plan. The 65% subsidy also begins March 1st and continues for the remainder of 2009. Employees will pay 35% of their premium to their former employer. The employer remits the 35% payment to the insurance company as payment in full. Thereafter, the insurance company applies for the remaining 65% reimbursement.

Bureau announces new program options

The Ohio BWC has introduced two new programs to help you save money on your workers' comp premiums.

Deductible Program

This program allows employers to participate in a per claim deductible plan, resulting in a prospective premium discount. The program goal is to encourage safety and effective claims management.

*****The deductible program is the only BWC program that can be stacked with group rating discounts.**

Group Retrospective Rating

Group retro is a voluntary performance based incentive program. BWC-certified sponsors create groups of employers who practice effective workplace safety and claims management to achieve lower premiums than they could as individuals.

These two new programs will be available beginning July 1, 2009, but have very short windows for enrollment. **The deadlines are May 31 for Deductible and June 26 for Group Retro.**

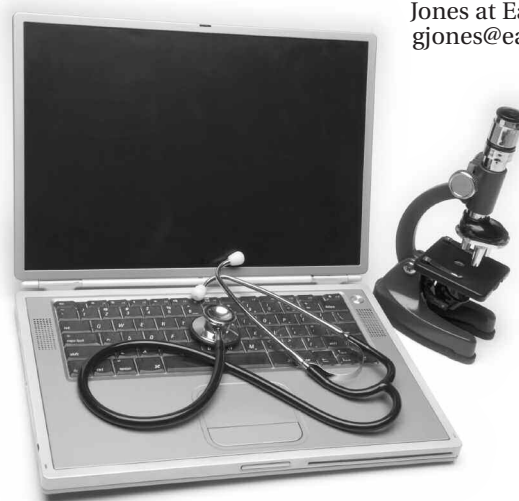

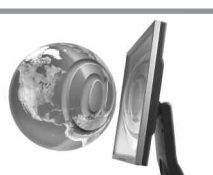

When an emergency strikes can your employees respond?

If your co-worker is burned by hot tar on the jobsite, would you know what to do?

If your buddy at work falls from a roof and is unconscious, could you respond?

If you see a car accident on your way to work, would you stop to help or simply drive by?

If your employees don't have the knowledge or confidence to provide care in an emergency situation, send them to a Standard First Aid/CPR class at the Builders Exchange.

Two course options are offered on a regular basis throughout the year, with the next sessions set for June at the BX:

- **Standard First Aid/CPR** – a six-hour program that teaches first-responder care for injuries and illnesses – including CPR, abdominal thrusts, bandaging and splints.
- **CPR Challenge** – a two-hour refresher class for students who have already attended the Standard First Aid/CPR class, but need to renew their CPR certificate.

Both classes are offered through the Emergency Care and Safety Institute, which issues certificates to students who successfully complete the training.

To receive a refund for either class, cancellations must be made at least one week prior to the starting date of the program. To register, call Kelly Purcell (ext. 223) at the BX.
