### HR and legal experts share how to plan for staffing changes at upcoming session

### Understand new insurance continuation requirements

To help employers who must provide insurance continuation information, the BX will host a program that will detail the new Stimulus Package Subsidy for COBRA and the State Continuation Program for small (fewer than 20 employees) companies.

Representatives from the Ohio Department of Insurance and CCI Benefit Solutions will conduct the hour-long seminar, which will be held at the Builders Exchange on Tuesday, June 9, 9:30-10:30 a.m.

"In addition to the subsidy and minor changes to COBRA, the stimulus and our state government have made significant changes for employees who are terminated from small businesses," stated Scott Miller (CCI Benefit Solutions).

The American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA), signed by President Obama, provides qualified individuals who are not eligible for other group coverage with a 65% government subsidy for up to nine months starting March 1, 2009 under the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 (COBRA).

"Attend the June 9 program to find out which employees are eligible for the subsidy, what notices must be sent and which files you must maintain," Miller added.

## Heads up, employers: big changes underway with workers' compensation

After extensive discussions and debate regarding the equity of Ohio's workers' compensation system — among staff at the Bureau of Workers' Compensation (BWC) and a coalition of professionals, including trade associations like the Builders Exchange — the BWC board has approved significant changes to the workers' compensation system.

"We cannot stress enough to employers that they need to understand and prepare for the impact these changes could immediately bring to their workers' comp costs," said Cathy Blackford, BX executive director.

"While we have very little time to react, we encourage all Exchange members to contact their third-party administrators for specific details on how these changes will affect their costs."

The Builders Exchange third party administrator for its Group Rating Plan, CareWorks Consultants, Inc. (CCI) prepared the following summary of the changes approved by the BWC board as of March 20:

### Base Rate Reduction & Group Assessment Factor

The BWC board approved an average 25.3% base rate reduction for all Ohio employers. However, this reduction will be offset for group-rated employers by a "Group Assessment Factor" of 31.1%. The bottom line: employers not in group rating plans will realize the base rate reduction and subsequent premium reduction for 2009, while group-rated employers will experience on average a 9.6% premium increase, according to the BWC.

**No Stacking of Discounts** - Beginning July 1, 2009, group-rated employers may no longer also receive discounts from the Drug-Free Workplace (DFEZ) or Safety Council programs.

### Elimination of the Premium Discount Program (PDP+)

Beginning July 1, 2009, the BWC is eliminating discounts associated with PDP+.

### New Programs Effective July 1, 2009

**100% Experience Modifier (EM) Cap** - Employers will have 2009 policy period premiums capped at 200%. In other words, an employer's premium may no more than double from one policy year to the next. The BWC will automatically apply this cap to any employer with an EM of 1.01 or greater, for the 2009 policy year. In addition to the penalty EM, employers must adhere to the Bureau's 10-Step Business Plan to take advantage of the caps.

**Group Retrospective Rating** - If selecting this option, employers receive premium rebates or assessments based on results of safety and cost control efforts. This program appears to be modeled after a similar program currently available in the state of Washington. While this program provides the potential for premium

savings, employers will share a pre-determined level of risk (assessments) with other plan participants. Deadline to enroll: June 26, 2009.

### Deductible Program - This new Deductible Program offers an upfront discount on employer premium rates in exchange for accepting the financial obligation, up to the deductible amount chosen, of any new claim incurred during the policy year beginning July 1, 2009. The program is set up to create incentives to promote workplace safety and proactive claims management. The deductible options range from \$500 to \$10,000 per claim. All claims incurred will continue to be charged by BWC against a company's future experience rating calculations (four years). (The deadline to enroll was May 31.)

"The June 26 deadline to enroll in Group Retro is coming up quickly," Blackford added. She urged companies in the BX Group Rating Program who have questions regarding the changes to contact CCI at 800/837-3200 and ask for Elaine Fouts or Dawn Lord.



## Safety Program

## Could you respond within 4 to 6 minutes?

OSHA requires that you respond to an employee emergency within a reasonable amount of time — about four to six minutes.

Even within a few miles of emergency medical services, construction sites pose sticky problems to meeting this guideline — traffic, new-build projects without known addresses, access to the site, getting to the location of the injured worker, etc. Learn to rely first on your employees with training you can trust from the BX — **Standard First Aid/CPR**.

Topics include:

- emergency response
- life-threatening emergencies, such as respiratory, choking and cardiac problems.
- severe cuts and burns, sprains and strains
- sudden illnesses such as poisonings, bites and stings
- heat- and cold-related emergencies
- workplace emergency planning

Offered several times throughout the year, the next class at the Exchange is scheduled for Wednesday, June 10 from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Registration and continental breakfast begin at 7:30 a.m.

The class will be taught by Mary Logan So, BX director of safety.

Upon successful completion of the course, you will receive a certificate in CPR that is valid for two years, and a certificate in

first aid that is valid for three years. Both certifications are offered by the Emergency Care and Safety Institute.

The course is \$45 for participants in the BX Workers' Comp Group, \$65 for other BX members and \$95 for nonmembers.

To receive refunds, written cancellations must be made one week in advance.

## Renew your CPR certificate for two years

If a refresher course is all you need, the BX Safety Program offers the CPR Challenge, a course designed to renew your CPR certificate.

At the class, you will receive a brief review of CPR and other lifesaving skills, and must pass both a written and a hands-on test to renew your certification.

The CPR Challenge is on Thursday, June 11 from 2 to 4 p.m. at the Exchange. Kelly Purcell (Builders Exchange) will teach the course.

The cost is \$35 for participants in the BX Workers' Comp Group, \$45 for other BX members and \$65 for nonmembers. To receive a refund, written cancellation requests must be made one week in advance.
