## Meet training requirements on Ohio School Facilities Commission jobs

Under Resolution 07-98, the Ohio School Facilities Commission decreed that contractors working on Ohio school projects must comply with "Responsible Bidding Requirements." Among the requirements include several safety provisions - including OSHA training.

Specifically, the OSFC says, "For projects advertised after October 1, 2007, the Executive Director will only approve contracts in which the Bidder has certified that it...has implemented a written safety program, that each member of his job site workforce has completed an OSHA 10 or 30 Hour Construction Course, and that all project supervisors and all project foremen have completed an OSHA 30 hour Construction Course," ([http://www.osfc.state.oh.us/pdfs/Resolution\\_07-98.pdf](http://www.osfc.state.oh.us/pdfs/Resolution_07-98.pdf)).

Don't miss out on complying with bidder requirements. Attend the next OSHA 30-Hour Training Course hosted by the Builders Exchange of Central Ohio.

Keith Snead (E4 Safety Professionals, LLC) will teach the course at the Exchange on Mondays and Wednesdays, July 13, 15, 20 and 22. The program begins with registration and a continental breakfast from 7:30 to 8 a.m., followed by the class from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

When you finish the class, you will receive a course completion card from the OSHA Training Institute.

The cost is \$469 per person for participants in the BX Workers' Comp Group and \$609 for other BX members. For

nonmembers, the cost is \$809.

A volume discount of 10 percent is offered for companies sending five or more participants, and 20 percent for companies sending 10 or more participants.
