DRUG-FREE TRAINING FOR SUPERVISORS AND EMPLOYEES

Are you compliant to bid on state jobs?

BWC's Drug-Free Workplace Program (DFWP) is an incentive program designed to help employers establish a safer and more cost-effective workplace.

And, in order to be compliant to bid on state jobs, you need to have a DFWP in place before any labor or supervision sets foot on a state of Ohio job site.

Employers participating in the BWC DFWP must implement the following components:

- Develop a written policy
- Offer employee education
- Provide supervisor training
- Conduct drug and alcohol testing
- Offer employee assistance

At BX drug-free classes, your employees will receive information on your company policy, their responsibilities, and the resources available to them if they need help. Supervisors will learn to observe and document changes in an employee, along with how to confront an employee if necessary.

These classes are instructed by trained BX staff and are held throughout the year. They have been approved by the Ohio Construction Industry Licensing Board (OCILB) for 2 hours in Health & Safety.

The BX is next offering training this Thursday, July 9, at the Exchange. Employee education is held from 8 to 10 a.m., and supervisor training from 10:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. To register, please contact Stacey Kruse (ext. 226) at the BX, or register online.

OSHA 10-Hour Training Course benefits all employees

When you attend the OSHA 10-Hour Training Course, you will learn:

- to work more safely and to help keep others safe
- about OSHA hazards and violations in a variety of different trades
- how to prevent OSHA violations and minimize fines for your company

In addition, students who successfully complete the class will receive wallet-sized course completion cards from the OSHA Training Institute in Chicago.

The BX offers the OSHA 10-Hour Training Course several times a year, with the next session set for Tuesday and Thursday, July 14 and 16.

The program begins with registration

and a continental breakfast from 7:30 to 8 a.m., followed by the class from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

Gary Hanson, Jr. (American Safety and Health Management Consultants, Inc.) will conduct the class.

The course covers 10 of the most dangerous and common hazards in the construction industry, including:

- fall protection
- scaffolding safety
- stairways and ladders
- excavations
- electrical safety
- personal protective equipment
- fire protection and prevention
- hand and power tools
- safety program and training
- hazard communication

The cost is \$129 per person for participants in the BX Workers' Comp Group and \$209 for other BX members. For nonmembers the cost is \$369, and nonmembers must pay in advance.

A volume discount of 10 percent is offered for companies sending five or more participants, and 20 percent for companies sending 10 or more participants.

To receive refunds, cancellation requests must be received one week in advance.
