The Rising Leaders Institute (RLI), supported by a grant from the Builders Exchange Foundation, is an intensive, 12-session program focused on building management skills and business knowledge of high potential individuals, and preparing them to serve as the future leaders in the construction industry.

Participants in the Rising Leaders Institute are required to have a champion from their company, a manager who acts as their mentor throughout the program. Faherty's mentor is J.D. Flaherty, Jr., president/owner of Construction Systems Inc.

With a curriculum developed for the Builders Exchange by The Ohio State University Fisher College of Business, the sessions are taught by OSU faculty members.

ENROLLMENT DEADLINE EXTENDED TO JULY 31

A new kind of group - group retrospective rating

Group retrospective rating is a voluntary, performance-based, incentive program. BWC-certified sponsors create groups of employers who practice effective workplace safety and claims management to achieve lower premiums than they could attain as individuals.

Safety and claims cost containment is an important step in the process to ensure your fellow group members are as committed as your company.

Employers continue to pay their own individual premiums and have the

opportunity to receive retrospective premium adjustments based upon the combined performance of the group. Depending on that performance, the participating employers can receive either a premium refund or assessment. This plan provides incentives to the group retro members to control and reduce losses. So, those members who control losses have the potential to see lower premiums.

Since this is a brand new program rolled-out by the BWC for the rating year beginning July 1, 2009, BWC board of directors voted on June 19 to extend the filing deadline from June 26 to July 31. This extension gives Ohio employers more time to understand the program - to help them make an informed decision about how it could benefit their companies.

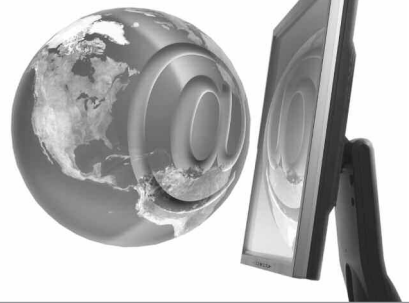
