2009 BX CRAFTSMANSHIP AWARD RECIPIENT



The Craftsman: Shane Allen of Bruner Corp.
His Winning Work: Reconstruction of the primary heating and cooling systems at One Nationwide Plaza

Craftsman Shane Allen is responsible for the reconstruction of the primary heating and cooling systems at One Nationwide Plaza. Allen led a crew of 14 to complete the HVAC piping on the 15th floor.

The project included switching the cooling plant from a primary only to a primary/secondary system; plus the addition of a heat exchanger that allows the cooling system to be used for internal building heat.

Among the challenges faced by Allen and his team were keeping the system operational around the clock with steady temperatures for the more than 6,000 building employees, and coordinating the delivery of project materials with limited elevator access.

Precise planning and delicate execution were

necessary in order to achieve a smooth transition in the tight work space. More than 200 feet of pipe and 200 fittings were layered into the existing mechanical room.

A member of Plumbers and Pipefitters Local 189, Allen has been employed by Bruner Corp. for 14 of his nearly 16 years in the trade.

A first-time Craftsmanship Award winner, Allen attended Columbus State Community College to study HVAC design before completing an apprenticeship program and starting in the trade.

"Currently a group of 20 member firms, the Network has been 'piloted' for about a year," said Cathy Blackford, BX executive director.

"The Network provides a unique, hands-on opportunity to learn safety," she said. "All companies involved host jobsite visits for another participating firm – and in turn, are hosted as visitors themselves on another site."

"This guided, one-on-one access to another company's project has opened up fantastic dialogue about why our members use the safety practices they do," said Blackford.

Launched with a small group of committed firms, the BX Safety Network now wants to expand the number and types of participating contractors.

"Nowhere else can you get an opportunity like this," said Mary Logan So, BX director of safety. "It's like getting an inside look at the best practices and safety efforts of firms across Central Ohio."

At quarterly meetings, participants discuss the best

practices they observed on each other's sites. They also have exchanged sample hazard analysis sheets, aerial jobsite photos that detail evacuations, inspection forms, and confined space entry permits.

Jeremy's road to success started in February, when Local Union 189's Joint Apprenticeship and Training Committee (JATC) reviewed its apprentice records and chose him to represent them in the Ohio Pipe Trades Apprentice Competition. The JATC selects its representatives based on grade point average, the number of certifications held and attendance.

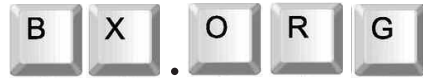
This young talent represented them well. Among 56 contestants in Ohio, Jeremy won first place in the MES category, which included rigging, safety, tube bending, equipment trouble-shooting, analyzing and fixing problems, soldering, brazing, reading construction drawings and taking a sequence of operations from an equipment or engineer's specification and converting it to a working electrical drawing diagram. Jeremy is the first apprentice from Local 189 to win the state competition, a four-day-long event, in this category.

Later at the regional level, he took on the state champions from West Virginia, Virginia, Maryland, Indiana, Kentucky, Michigan, Pennsylvania and Washington, D.C., in a similar format – and brought home another first place trophy!

Jeremy entered his five-year apprenticeship right out of high school, and has been employed with Speer the entire time. As he heads to national competition on August 9, the BX wants him to know our local industry will be rooting for him.

But he already is a champion and we're lucky to have him in this community of construction.
