## Good News New hires at Turner Construction lead community service project

On a stormy Saturday, after a hard week of work, the last thing I'd feel like doing is spending the day in the rain with my co-workers – and competitors – painting, planting and cleaning up the homes and yards of strangers.

But that's what 100 of our industry's best did on July 25, as volunteers rallied to support a community service project spearheaded by seven employees of Turner Construction Co.

The seven members of this year's "Leadership Turner" Columbus team were part of a corporate program for new hires, requiring them to work together on "an act of kindness for our respective communities," said team member Abram Reece. He said the team approached Nationwide Children's Hospital, a Turner client, to ask if it had any needs.

"We then heard that the hospital – through Healthy Housing, Healthy Families – had a plan in place to fix up the community surrounding the hospital. We knew right away that this was something we wanted to pursue," Abram said.

Working with Nationwide Children's, the team identified two deserving families who lived on Carpenter Street. They planned a project that would improve the appearance of the two homes and use their abilities ... and those of their extremely qualified construction contacts!

"We knew we couldn't complete this event without help, so we challenged area contractors to come out and join us in one working day to make a difference in the community," Abram said. "They were just as excited as we were, and they exceeded our expectations with their donations and time."

## 2009 BX CRAFTSMANSHIP AWARD RECIPIENT



**The Craftsman:** Jim Bigler of Legacy Commercial Flooring  
**His Winning Work:** Installation of ceramic porcelain tile at the Safe Auto corporate offices

The skilled craftsmanship of Jim Bigler is evident the moment you step through the revolving doors at the Safe Auto corporate offices.

Leading a crew of three, Bigler installed the elaborate ceramic porcelain flooring in the massive two-story main lobby rotunda and the elevator lobbies.

The main lobby showcases an intricate circular design that incorporates a medallion of the company logo as the center feature. Near the elevators, the tiles are all placed on 45-degree angles.

Both areas demanded tight grout joints and precise angle tolerances. Each piece of stone was custom cut and fabricated on site in a variety of shapes and sizes. Measurements had to be meticulous to guarantee a perfect fit.

The angles in the flooring are continued throughout other aspects of the building, so Bigler worked closely with the other trades to ensure that each section flowed together.

A member of Bricklayers Local 55, Bigler has been employed by Legacy Commercial Flooring for 36 of his 37 years in the trade.

A first-time Craftsmanship Award recipient, Bigler has two brothers who are also involved in the flooring trade. All three work for Legacy Commercial Flooring.
