Companies recognized for safety excellence

Recently, the Builders Exchange proudly announced the winners of the fourteenth annual BX Safety Recognition Program.

Thirty-three companies were honored with a BX Safety Achievement Award for outstanding safety statistics

and jobsite performance, and five companies received eight total BX Safety Innovation Awards for unique safety practices.

Congratulations to Parks Drilling Co.:

Parks Drilling Company, 5745 Avery Road, Dublin, Ohio 43016-9731

Parks Drilling Co. earns the firm's first Innovation Award for creating a steel barricade system to protect the open excavation of a drilled shaft.

Using steel casing, Parks Drilling developed systems of multiple diameters, ranging from 36 to 84 inches. The smaller systems have one swing gate for access, while the larger systems are designed with two. The gates allow for auger access without having to dismantle a section, weakening the entire system.

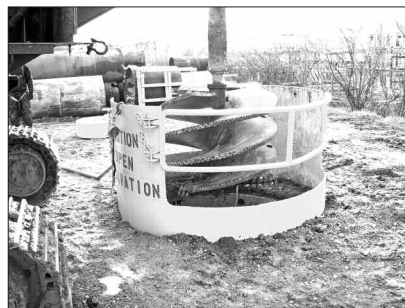
The height of the system meets OSHA's standards for barricades.

The frequent solution currently in use for this situation is the use of traditional round bale cattle feeders; however, Parks' system better meets the OSHA standards. Should an employee fall into or lean on the barricade, it will not move. The weights of

the system vary from 450 pounds to more than 1,000 pounds, depending upon the diameter.

In addition to providing a barricade, the system is engineered with an anchor point for fall protection. Using a shock-absorbing lanyard, or self-retracting lifeline, employees can be attached to the lifting hole with a shackle. The anchorage point has been tested by an engineer to withstand OSHA requirements.

After using the system, Parks has received positive feedback from employees, as well as other contractors. Once the concrete placement has been completed, the barricades can be removed and stored for future use.

The Craftsman: His Winning Work:

Scott Kuns of Anderson Aluminum Corp. New curtainwalls, skylights and interior glass walls; as well as restoration of existing windows at the Thompson Library on The Ohio State University campus.

Scott Kuns' experience, skill and attention to detail are evident in the new and restored windows at the Thompson Library on The Ohio State University campus.

Kuns and a crew of eight were responsible for the restoration and expansion of existing windows in the historical Grand Reference Room along with the installation of a suspended curtainwall in the modern building addition.

Interior features include structural glass walls that span five stories inside the 16-level building. Each wall contains over 200 glass panes that measure 54 by 90-inches and weigh 415 pounds. The glass is secured by a spider fitting where the four corners meet.

The library also features two skylights that measure

86 by 48 feet and were set in place using a tower crane. Remaining work was performed from a swing stage during the winter months in order to keep the project on schedule.

Kuns has been in the construction industry for 25 years and has spent his entire career with Anderson Aluminum Corp.

This is Kuns' second Craftsmanship Award. He was also recognized in 2000 for the glass installation and glazing work at COSI.

This year, the Builders Exchange will honor 13 Craftsmanship Award recipients at the BX Annual Meeting on Thursday, Nov. 19, at the Aladdin Shrine Center, 3850 Stelzer Rd.
