EARN OSHA COURSE COMPLETION CARDS

Meet training requirements on Ohio School Facilities Commission jobs

Under Resolution 07-98, the Ohio School Facilities Commission decreed that contractors working on Ohio school projects must comply with "Responsible Bidding Requirements." Among the requirements include several safety provisions – including OSHA training.

Specifically, the OSFC says, "For projects advertised after October 1, 2007, the Executive Director will only approve contracts in which the Bidder has certified that it...has implemented a written safety program, that each member of his job site workforce has completed an OSHA 10 or 30 Hour Construction Course, and that all project supervisors and all project foremen have completed an OSHA 30 hour Construction Course," (http://www.osfc.state.oh.us/pdfs/Resolution_07-98.pdf).

Don't miss out on complying with bidder requirements. Attend the next OSHA 30-Hour Training Course hosted by the Builders Exchange of Central Ohio.

Tim Roberts (Safety Alliance, LLC) will teach the course at the Exchange on four consecutive Fridays – Oct. 16, 23, 30 and Nov. 6. The program begins with registration and a continental breakfast from 7:30 to 8 a.m., followed by the class from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

When you finish the class, you will receive a course completion card from the OSHA Training Institute.

The cost is \$469 per person for participants in the BX Workers' Comp Group and \$609 for other BX members. For nonmembers, the cost is \$809.

A volume discount of 10 percent is offered for companies sending five or more participants, and 20 percent for companies sending 10 or more participants.

To receive refunds, cancellation requests must be made by Friday, Oct. 9. To register, call Kelly Purcell (ext. 223) at the BX.

2009 BX CRAFTSMANSHIP AWARD RECIPIENT



The Craftsman: Mark Mead of H.K. Phillips Restoration, Inc.
His Winning Work: Removal of existing stone work and replacement of new materials at the Broad Street United Methodist Church

The intricate stone masonry at the Broad Street United Methodist Church is the work of craftsman Mark Mead.

The historic building was constructed in 1885 and the original porous serpentine stone was breaking away from the church creating a safety hazard.

One of the challenges Mead faced was maintaining the structural integrity of the building. As the original stone was removed, the walls became too thin to support the roof structure. Walls had to be shored while the new stone was added in small sections, anchored with stainless steel connectors and mortared in place. Mead's ability to envision the complete façade was critical to his success.

Mead and his crew of nine removed approximately

370 tons of stone from the site and replaced it with nearly 440 tons of new material including durable, manufactured cast stone.

A past member of Bricklayers Local 55, Mead has been employed by H.K. Phillips Restoration, Inc. for his entire 35-year career in the industry.

A first-time Craftsmanship Award winner, Mead has also worked on projects at the James A. Rhodes State Office Tower, the William Green Building and the Vern Riffe Center for Government and the Arts.

This year, the Builders Exchange will honor 13 Craftsmanship Award recipients at the BX Annual Meeting on Thursday, Nov. 19, at the Aladdin Shrine Center, 3850 Stelzer Rd.

This course is ideal for construction managers, field superintendents, foremen, leadmen, and field employees wanting to further develop their management and leadership techniques to improve their skills within the industry.

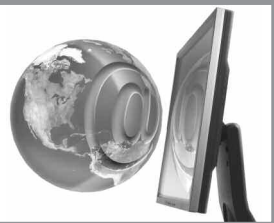
