Be prepared for flu pandemic

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention website, cdc.gov, Ohio is currently one of 27 states experiencing widespread influenza activity.

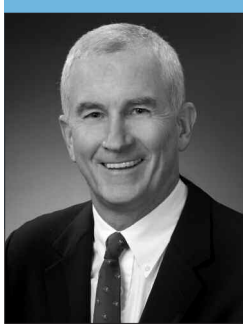
A construction management graduate of Columbus State Community College, he is a member of the New Albany Rotary Club.

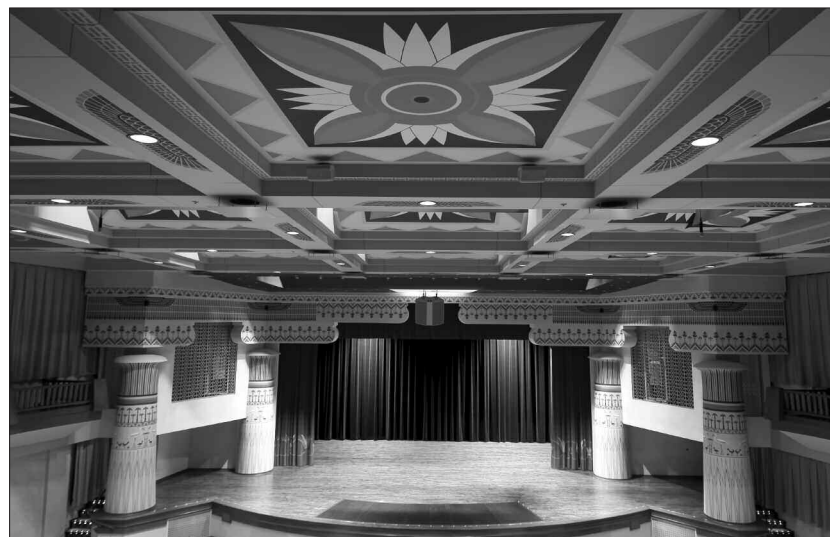

The Craftsman: John Stamper of Martin Painting & Coating Co.
His Winning Work: Decorative interior painting at the Lincoln Theatre

Foresight, attention to detail and a steady hand helped John Stamper complete the decorative interior painting at the newly renovated Lincoln Theater.

Stamper led a crew of 15 to complete hundreds of hours of hand painting and stenciling throughout the audience chamber. The work is displayed on four large columns near the stage, four smaller columns at the back of the theater, on the ceiling, along the proscenium arch and next to the main entrance to the hall.

Prior to picking up a paintbrush, Stamper took great care to develop a flawless layout for the project. Matching the pattern on the columns required ongoing mathematical calculations to allow for the tapered structure.

The ceiling created a similar challenge as the coffers

were different sizes in order to allow for stage lights and other theater equipment.

Built in 1928, the theater had been empty since the 1970's. Stamper reviewed many historical photographs in order to duplicate the original Egyptian design.

Stamper has been a painter for 24 years. He has worked for Martin Painting & Coating Co. for the past six years.

Stamper is a first-time Craftsmanship Award winner. He started his painting career working for his father-in-law on residential projects.

This year, the Builders Exchange will honor 13 Craftsmanship Award recipients at the BX Annual Meeting on Thursday, Nov. 19, at the Aladdin Shrine Center, 3850 Stelzer Rd.

Packed house takes home their share of \$500,000

A crowd of more than 300 filled the Makoy Center last Wednesday to pick up their firm's share of more than a half a million dollars. The money was being returned to participants of the Safety Council of Greater Columbus in conjunction with the October meeting.

Each year, the Safety Council of Greater Columbus enrolls eligible firms in the state's safety council incentive program. Firms that attend at least 10 monthly safety meetings, one of which attended by a CEO, and submit two Semi-Annual injury reports are eligible for a 2% rebate on

their workers' compensation premiums. In 2008-2009, 280 firms successfully completed the program.

And the earning isn't over. For companies that not only met the participation requirements, but also decreased their frequency or severity by 10%, they will receive another check in December for an additional 2% rebate on their premiums.

"The monetary incentive to participate in the SCGC is a great carrot," said Mark Ogle (Trucco Construction Co., Inc.). "But what we hope to accomplish is to share safety information that improves a company's safety program,

decreases incidents, and increases safety awareness."

"Then we know we've really done our job."

Currently, 2009-2010 participants are working toward earning their rebate in October of 2010. For more information on the Safety Council of Greater Columbus, visit www.safecolumbus.org or call Mary Logan So (ext. 236) at the BX.
