## Make your company more productive and competitive

## NEW BWC REQUIREMENT

# Two hours of additional safety training needed before June 30

Ohio Bureau of Workers' Compensation's (BWC) new rule mandates that any employer currently participating in a group rating program that has experienced a workers' compensation claim between January 1, 2007 and December 31, 2008 must complete a **required** two hours of additional safety training before June 30, 2010.

BWC's requirement applies to **all** approved claims an employer has had within the timeframe stated above, regardless of size or severity.

If an employer has experienced more than one claim within this period, they are still only obligated to attend two hours of safety training.

The regular training you perform to comply with OSHA, DOT or Drug-Free regulations **will not** count toward this requirement.

Any company representative can fulfill the two-hour training obligation.

In order to assist you in fulfilling this requirement, the BX is holding two events on Thursday, March 4, from 1 to 3 p.m., and Friday, March 12, 8:30 to 10:30 a.m., at the Exchange. Topics will include:

- **Accident Investigation:** Developing a comprehensive accident plan and having the proper tools and documents readily available will help you capture the essential information and protect your business.

- **Keys to Effective Safety Program Management:** This presentation focuses on BWC's 10-Step Business Plan for Safety, which is a primary component of many BWC programs. Group-rating participants are strongly encouraged to implement these components to help prevent injuries and control workers' compensation costs.

- **OSHA Update:** You will learn the top citations being issued for general industry and construction over the past year so you can ensure your business is in compliance. We will also look at trends in workplace injury rates and the new focus of the agency under the Obama administration, including the new rules that are under development and the industries being targeted.

## Safety Program

# Gain compliance with a simple posting

Don't forget that Feb. 1 marks the first day of 2010 that OSHA requires employers to post the OSHA 300A summary. The summary shows the total number of job-related injuries and illnesses that occurred at your company in 2009.

If you haven't already, post the 300A summary (not the complete OSHA 300 form) in a conspicuous area where all construction employees have access to view it. Even companies with no recordable injuries and illnesses in 2009 must post the log with zeros in the total lines.

The 300A document must be posted from Feb. 1 through April 30.

At the same time, you can evaluate your company's safety successes from 2009. Using the 300A document, you can determine your company's OSHA statistics that are often used in the bidding process. Using the numbers from your OSHA 300 Log from 2009, you can discover your Total Case Rate and DART Rate (Days Away Restricted Transfer).

Why should these rates matter? For starters, safety savvy owners request this information to compare to the statistics posted by the Bureau of Labor Statistics. It can be used to determine which contractors will be eligible to bid a job. If you're not figuring this rate properly, it can cost you business.

OSHA's 2008 Summary of Total Case Rates and DART Rates by industry type are available on the [www.bls.gov](http://www.bls.gov) website now. Use the following website address to take you right to the data - <http://www.bls.gov/iif/oshwc/osh/os/ostb2071.pdf>.

This information is published using NAICS codes (North American Industry Classification System). The North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) has replaced the U.S. Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system. They were developed jointly by the U.S., Canada, and Mexico to provide new comparability in statistics about business activity across North America.

Keep in mind, that the BLS data is always a year behind, i.e., as you finish your OSHA 300 logs for 2009, the Bureau of Labor Statistics releases the information for 2008. Use the chart below for more information on calculating your company statistics.

## Calculate your company statistics

### 2009 INJURY/ILLNESS INCIDENCE RATE – DART RATE (Days Away Restricted Transfer):

Your company's lost workday/restricted workday incidence rate is called your DART rate – for Days Away from work and days of Restricted work activity or job Transfer. To determine this rate, use the following calculation:

$$\frac{\text{Total number of recordable incidents with a checkmark in columns H and I on your OSHA 300 Log}}{\text{Total hours worked by all your employees}} \times 200,000 = \text{Your lost workday \& restricted workday rate, also know as your DART rate:}$$

In the calculation, 200,000 is the base for 100 full-time workers, working 40 hours per week, 50 weeks per year. All employers use 200,000 in the calculation – regardless of your company size.

### 2009 INJURY/ILLNESS INCIDENCE RATE - TOTAL CASE RATE:

Your company's total case incidence rate is your rate of all OSHA-recordable injury and illness cases for the year – including cases with lost workdays, restricted workdays and other recordable cases. To determine this rate, use the following calculation.

$$\frac{\text{Total number of recordable incidents with a checkmark in columns H, I and J on your OSHA 300 Log}}{\text{Total hours worked by all your employees}} \times 200,000 = \text{Your total case incidence rate:}$$

In the calculation, 200,000 is the base for 100 full-time workers, working 40 hours per week, 50 weeks per year. All employers use 200,000 in the calculation – regardless of your company size.

Keep in mind that your DART rate cannot be higher than your total case rate because all of the cases included in DART are also included in the Total Case Rate.
