## US EPA publishes final rule on renovation, repair and painting

Beginning April 2010, Contractors that perform renovation, repair and painting projects that disturb lead based paint in homes, child care facilities, and schools built before 1978 must be certified and follow specific work practices to prevent lead contamination.

Specifically, residential contractors working in homes built before 1978 and nonresidential contractors working in schools that were built before 1978 that have preschool and kindergarten activities would be affected.

### Excluded

Excluded are lead-based paint abatement projects as well as small projects that disturb two square feet or less of painted surface per component, emergency projects, and renovations affecting components that have been found to be free of lead-based paint.

Also excluded are minor repair and maintenance activities. These activities include minor heating, ventilation or air conditioning

work, electrical work, and plumbing that disrupt six square feet or less of painted surface per room for interior activities or 20 square feet or less of painted surface for exterior activities where none of the work practices prohibited or restricted. The work must not involve window replacement or demolition of painted surface areas.

### Requirement Summary Notification Requirements

< 60 days prior to renovation

1. Obtain written acknowledgement of receipt of pamphlet <http://www.epa.gov/opptintr/lead/pubs/renovaterightbrochure.pdf>
2. Provide information describing the general nature and location of renovation and anticipated completion date.
3. Post pamphlet and information signs re: nature and location of renovation and anticipated completion dates
4. Document above actions and retain for three years

### Work Practices

1. Post signs
2. Contain work area
3. Ban prohibited practices
4. Proper waste handling and removal
5. Clean work area
6. Verify adequacy of cleaning

1. Retain records to demonstrate compliance for three (3) years
2. Pamphlet
3. Certified renovator on project
4. OTJ training for workers
5. Work practices

### Firm Certification

1. EPA certification (may take up to 90 days)

  2. Recertification every five (5) years

### Firm Responsibilities

1. Certified renovator assigned to each renovation <http://www.epa.gov/opptintr/lead/pubs/trainingproviders.htm#oha>.
  - a. Direct workers
  - b. Provide training to workers
  - c. Be on site when signs are posted,

- containment is established and area is cleaned
- d. Responsible for ensuring work practices are followed
  - e. Be available on site or by telephone at all times
  - f. Use test kit when requested by customer
  - g. Must have on site copies of training certificates
  - h. Must maintain records
2. Remaining staff trained by the certified renovator
  3. Trained dust sampling technician

**Note:** the Ohio Department of Health plans to seek approval from the US EPA to enforce the regulation in Ohio. Until then, the US EPA is the enforcing agency.

Currently Safex does not hold the certification to teach this program; however, the firm is currently pursuing authorization to teach. More information to follow.

4. Think outside the box. This award recognizes those individuals who have done outstanding work on a project. That can mean performing the craft itself or overcoming project obstacles in a new and creative way.

## Drug-free training for supervisors and employees

Some companies are drug-free to meet federal requirements. Others take advantage of financial incentives available through voluntary state programs. Still others decide that being drug-free is imperative to the success of their business. Whatever the reasons, employee education and supervisor training are essential parts of these programs.

## Find opportunity in the safety hazards faced by your employees

"Coming up with a BX Safety Innovation is all about looking at the hazards your guys in the field face," said Mark Ogle (Trucco Construction Co.) "If you have an accident, or a near-miss, it's an opportunity to think about what you could do to make sure the incident never occurs again."

Trucco Construction Co. understands how important employee involvement is when trying to improve company safety practices. The firm won an Innovation Award in 2006-2007 and another in 2007-2008. The firm's first award was a ladder bracket device fabricated to secure ladders to trench boxes. It also insured proper height above the ground. In 2008, Trucco was recognized with their second Innovation Award for a manhole cross to

serve as a portable fall restraint system.

Often the field employees, the individuals exposed to the hazard, are the first to offer suggestions on what could be done to make their job easier – and safer. These suggestions often meet the criteria for a BX Safety Innovation Award.

"Not all ideas are Innovation worthy," said BX Director of Safety Mary Logan So. "It's not that the idea isn't a fantastic approach to safety. It just might not be unique."

"For example, for the past six years we've received applications about stretching programs going on in the field. This is a great reaction to the growing cost of ergonomic injuries; however, dozens of companies are doing it, and the practice has been part of general industry for more

than a decade."

"While the BX applauds these efforts, they don't meet the criteria of the award because they are not unique."

The duplicate submissions by different firms do demonstrate a shift in attention to safety in the field. It's now common to find questions about OSHA and BWC rates, OSHA history, and written safety programs on pre-qualification forms for bidding.
